

## MUSIC/CHOIR DIRECTOR

Could you be the new part-time, fun-loving Music/Choir Director for Community Unitarian Universalist Church in northeast Plano? This church is a progressive environment that welcomes you, whatever your background, gender or orientation. You love to develop amateur singers into a polished choir, and you have mastered the head-nod entrance that lets you accompany and conduct at the same time. You set a cheerful, encouraging energy in rehearsals and performance, taking advantage of the wide range of music our congregation enjoys. Finally, you have excellent communication and organizational skills; you welcome collaboration with the minister on services and are unafraid to work the coffee hour to recruit new singers.

Community UU Church has about 150 members and, pre-pandemic, had 15-20 enthusiastic amateur choir members. The building has been undergoing repairs, and we expect to resume in-person services in February.

The Music Director's duties include once-a-week evening choir rehearsals (August-June), conducting the choir and playing piano for two Sunday services per month, scheduling musicians for the remaining Sundays, and general planning and leadership of the church music program. The choir also sponsors/organizes a fundraising show once a year. The position (nominally quarter-time) usually requires about 20-25 hours/month and pays \$900/month. Benefits include use of church facilities for private instruction and recitals and right of first refusal to perform at weddings and funerals held at CUUC, for additional compensation, and paid one-month vacation in July.
